



Guidelines for Vaccinated Close Contacts

What Does it Mean to be Fully Vaccinated?

- Someone is fully vaccinated after 14 days from the final dose of a COVID-19 immunization series.

What is considered a close contact?

- Exposure within 6 feet for 15 minutes cumulative to a confirmed case of COVID-19.

I am fully vaccinated and had a close contact, what do I do?

- Get a COVID-19 test 5-7 days after the exposure. Wear a mask in indoor public settings for 14 days or until you receive a negative test result. Monitor for symptoms for the full 14 days.

I am fully vaccinated and I was exposed to someone with COVID-19. I am now symptomatic. What do I need to do?

- Contact a healthcare provider to be evaluated for testing. Stay home while you wait for test results.
- If you are not tested, you need to isolate at home for 10 days from the start of symptoms.

I am 14 days or less past my final dose of COVID-19 vaccine and I was exposed to someone with COVID-19. What do I need to do?

- You are not considered fully vaccinated yet. Stay home and follow the CDC's guidelines for the [7-10 day quarantine options](#). Monitor for symptoms for the full 14 days after the exposure.
