## TERRA NOVA

Our 3rd-8th graders will be taking the Terra Nova tests during the week of September 30- October 4. For the most part, testing will take place in the morning, so please avoid scheduling appointments during the morning hours if possible. Your child's teacher will have a detailed schedule of testing times.

## NURSE NOTES

**Vomiting, nausea, or diarrhea** - If your child is vomiting please keep them home for the duration of any symptoms. It is recommended that students are symptom free for 24 hours without the use of medication to reduce symptoms. Be sure that your child is able to eat food and drink fluids without difficulty before returning to school.

**Fever** - A fever is considered to be 100.0 degrees Fahrenheit or above. Students may not be in attendance at school until they have been fever-free for 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medications (Tylenol, Motrin, Advil, etc.). This is important to reduce the spread of illness at school.

**All families** - Please print off and send in the [annual student health information](#) update if you have not done so already.

**Medication reminder** - Any medication at school must have parent and physician authorization...including over the counter medications. Cough drops are the only exception that only require parent note.
